



Bellaire High School Endowment Fund Consolidated Application Form for 2020



The following information is to be completed by the applicant and forwarded to the Bellaire High School Guidance Office for further processing not later than **March 15, 2020** to be considered for this year. All information will need to be corroborated in the event that you are selected as the recipient an award.

I am applying for the following scholarship(s) administered by the Bellaire High School Endowment Board. **I understand that if selected to receive a scholarship, I will attend the Bellaire High School Alumni Association annual banquet on Saturday, May 16th at Undo’s, St. Clairsville as a guest of the Endowment Board to receive my award. All Endowment Fund scholarships will be awarded that evening. Failure to attend the banquet will result in an applicant not receiving a scholarship.**

Note that scholarships are only paid if the recipient submits transcripts to the Endowment Board at the end of their first semester of college. Monies are sent directly to the college the student is enrolled.

June Robson Memorial Scholarship

The June Robson Memorial Scholarship is \$1000.00 payable in two separate \$500.00 installments over two consecutive school years. To be eligible for the award, a graduating senior must have maintained through February of their year of graduation a cumulative GPA of 2.5. The recipient of the award is chosen based upon grades, financial need, and attitude and leadership skills. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Lorrie Klempa Davis Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is \$400 payable in the first year of schooling beyond high school. To be eligible for the award, a graduating student of Bellaire High School must intend to pursue a career in nursing or some other medical related field of study. The student must also have maintained a cumulative GPA of C or 2.0 on a 4.0 scale. Of those students who are eligible, selection of the recipient will be made on the basis of grades, financial need, and the input and recommendation of the health teachers at BHS. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Richard Bonar Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is \$1000.00 payable in two separate \$500.00 installments over two consecutive school years. To be eligible for the award, a graduating senior's family income must be less than that published by the State of Ohio as the average state family income for the preceding school year. Of those students who are eligible, the student with the highest cumulative GPA while attending BHS is given the award. In the event that two or more students have identical cumulative GPA's, the award is given to the student with the lowest family income. Applications for the award are maintained in the Bellaire High School Guidance Office. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Italian American Citizens Scholarship

The Italian American Citizens Scholarship is a \$500.00 award to any student of Italian descent with a 2.5 GPA or higher. The recipient of the scholarship will be determined on the basis of financial need, grades and the essay that accompanies this application. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Robert J. and Laurajane Burda Award

The Burda Award is a \$250.00 award for those who intend to pursue an education at a Technical College or School. Eligibility for this scholarship shall be any male and female student who has maintained an overall grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale through February of the year of their graduation as certified by the Bellaire High School Guidance Office on the application, and whose family income is below the Ohio Family Median Income. Eligibility shall be based upon the information provided by the student in the application that will be required in order to apply for the Book Award. The male recipient and female recipient of the award shall be determined on the basis of that male student and that female student whose family median income falls below the Ohio Family Median Income in the year of application, and whose Accumulative Grade Point Average is the highest for each male and female category. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Alan Banker Memorial Scholarship

The Alan Banker Memorial Scholarship is a \$500.00 award for a student attending **The Ohio State University**. The recipient of the award is chosen based upon grades – 3.0 GPA or higher, attitude and leadership skills. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Dennis S. Pogany Family Scholarship

The Dennis S. Pogany Family Scholarship is a \$1,000 award for a student who displays the following: strong abilities in athletics, strong abilities in leadership, strong ability in citizenship, be involved in several extra curricular activities, and have a 2.5 GPA or higher. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Diane Ledder Scholarship Trust

The Diane Ledder Scholarship is a \$10,000.00 award paid over a four-year period. \$2,500 is paid annually. The recipient must be enrolled and accepted to a secondary education institution in a program leading to not less than an Associates Degree. Payment is contingent upon and payable only after the recipient produces evidence of good standing as a full time (12 credit hours or its equivalent) student maintaining not less than a C average or a 2.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale at the end of their first quarter or semester of enrollment. Upon production of such evidence, the \$2,500 scholarship award shall be paid to the institution for the credit of the student against tuition and fees. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution.

The recipient of the scholarship shall be determined on the basis of financial need, grades, and input and recommendation of David Grant, Tom Ledder, and Kathy Wallace (original will trustees) or other designee as well as all factors presented on the application of the student.

Jessica Frizzi Memorial Scholarship

The Jessica Frizzi Memorial Scholarship is a \$1,000 award payable in two separate \$500 installments over the student's first academic school year. In order to be eligible to receive the award, the recipient must enroll in and be accepted to an accredited private or public college or university; community college; or a technical or trade school leading to some certification or license. Payment is contingent upon and payable only after the recipient produces evidence of good standing as a full time (12 credit hours or its equivalent) student maintaining not less than a C average or a 2.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale at the end of their first quarter or semester of enrollment. Upon production of such evidence, the first \$500 shall be paid to the institution for the credit of the student against tuition and fees. The second installment of the award of \$500 shall be payable on the same terms and conditions only upon completion of the second quarter or semester of the academic school year. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution. The award shall be conferred by a member of the BHS Endowment Fund Board, a member of the David and Jody Frizzi family, or their designee. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

This scholarship award shall be available first to those graduating seniors who are members of the Red Line Dance Team, and who have made application for the same through the Bellaire High School Guidance Office on or before the date designated. If a Redline member does not apply, the award may be given to another member of the graduating class who has made proper application.

Clara & Dom Presutti Scholarship

The Dom & Clara Presutti Scholarship is a \$1,065.00 scholarship. Dom & Clara worked a total of 32 years in the Bellaire School District. Clara was a school nurse/health teacher and Dom was an elementary/middle school teacher. They are both BHS graduates and all four of their children graduated from BHS. In 2012, the Presutti children established this scholarship in honor of their parent's 65th wedding anniversary, which is reflected in the amount of the scholarship.

Any senior, with a 2.5 GPA or better, who is pursuing an **education** or **medical** degree at an accredited school is eligible to apply. The recipient of the scholarship shall be determined on the basis of financial need, grades, and the essay that accompanies this application.

Payment is contingent upon and payable only after the recipient produces evidence of good standing as a full time (12 credit hours or its equivalent) student maintaining not less than a C average or a 2.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale at the end of their first quarter or semester of enrollment. Upon production of such evidence, the \$1,065 scholarship award shall be paid to the institution for the credit of the student against tuition and fees. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

VE Scholarship

This scholarship was established to assist students who have been in the band, choir and thespians or those who have taken part in athletics. Any senior, with a 2.5 GPA or better, who is attending college locally to pursue a two-year or four-year degree or attend a trade school may apply for this award. Students attending Ohio University Eastern, Belmont College, Wheeling Jesuit University, Bethany College, West Liberty University, West Virginia Northern Community College, Franciscan University or Scott College of Cosmetology are eligible to apply. The award will be presented to one student from the arts and one athlete in the amount of \$250.00. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution the student is attending.

Rich Saffield Memorial Scholarship

The Rich Saffield Memorial Scholarship was established by Carol Meholovich Saffield in memory of her husband. Rich, BHS Class of 1958, was a long-time teacher and basketball coach at several schools in the area. The scholarship is a \$500.00 award for a student majoring in education. The applicant must have a high school GPA of 3.2 or higher to apply. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution the student is attending.

Forest Hills Community Association Scholarship

This \$1,000.00 scholarship award shall be available to 1 graduating senior at Bellaire High School who meets the criteria set forth below:

ELIGIBILITY/SELECTION

1. Have one parent or legal guardian who is a bona fide legal resident of West Bellaire as defined by the geographic parameters below:

Home address must fall between (and inclusive of) Taney Avenue to 6th Avenue and Shady Lane to Washington Street. Demonstrate a cumulative GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale through 7 semesters of high school as documented by the school's Guidance Office.

Demonstrate acceptance to an accredited 4-year university or college, a 2- year associate program, or a technical school.

- a. Financial need and merit shall be considered in the selection of the recipient, with demonstrated need being the primary consideration.
 - i. Demonstrated need shall be defined as showing household income that is less than the state average family income as published by the state of Ohio for the preceding year.
 - ii. The financial aid package from the institution that the student will be attending shall be submitted to the selection committee.
 - iii. Merit is defined as community or school activities/service.
 - iv. Should multiple students have demonstrated need, GPA will be considered.
2. Distribution of Scholarship Monies
 - a. The scholarship total shall be \$1,000, distributed in two separate \$500.00 payments.
 - b. Payments shall be made directly to the school at which the student is enrolled.
 - c. The first \$500 payment shall be made after the award recipient provides first semester college grades to the HS Endowment Board demonstrating a minimum of a 2.0 GPA.
 - d. The second \$500 payment shall be made after the award recipient provides first year-end grades to the Endowment Board, demonstrating a minimum of a 2.0 GPA.
 - e. No monies for this scholarship will be paid directly to the student. All monies will be paid directly to the school the student is attending.

NOTE: Should the school not have a student who meets the criteria in a given year, no scholarship will be given.

James R. and Mary Shiretta Wallace Scholarship

The James R. and Mary Shiretta Wallace Scholarship, both from the Class of 1942, is a \$1,000.00 scholarship paid in two separate \$500.00 installments over two consecutive school years. To be eligible for this award, a graduating senior must have:

1. Maintained a 2.75 GPA through their 3rd nine weeks of their senior year for consideration.
2. Attend a local college or trade school to pursue a two-year or a four-year degree. Students attending Ohio University Eastern, Belmont College, Wheeling Jesuit University, Bethany College, West Liberty University, West Virginia Northern Community College, Franciscan University, Scott College of Cosmetology or Elite Academy of Hair Design are eligible to apply.
3. Maintained a level of employment working summers/after school while a student at BHS.
4. Points will be awarded for applicants who participate in athletics, cheering, band, chorus, thespians or other recognized school activity.
5. Bonus points will be awarded for volunteer service that is documented.

6. A completed Bellaire High School Endowment Fund Scholarship Consolidated Application Form is required for consideration for this scholarship.

No funds for this scholarship shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Nancy Gulley Trigg Memorial Scholarship

The Nancy Gulley Trigg Memorial Scholarship, Class of 1955, is a \$1,000.00 award for a cheerleader enrolling and accepted to a secondary education institution in a program leading to not less than an associate degree. Payment is contingent upon and payable only after the recipient produces evidence of good standing as a full time (12 credit hours or its equivalent) student maintaining not less than a C average or a 2.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale at the end of their first quarter or semester of enrollment. Upon production of such evidence, the \$1,000 scholarship award shall be paid to the institution for the credit of the student against tuition and fees. No funds for the award shall be paid to any person other than the institution. If a cheerleader does not apply, the award may be given to another member of the graduating class who has made proper application at the discretion of the Endowment Board to award the scholarship.

No funds for this scholarship shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Pappano Family Scholarship

The Pappano Family Scholarship is a \$5,000.00 scholarship paid in two separate \$2,500.00 installments after the first and second semesters. January and August payment. To be eligible for this award, a graduating senior must have:

1. Maintained a 2.75 GPA through their 3rd nine weeks of their senior year for consideration.
2. Attend a local college, university or trade school to pursue a two-year or a four-year degree. Students attending Ohio University Eastern, Belmont College, Wheeling University, Bethany College, West Liberty University, West Virginia Northern Community College, Franciscan University, Scott College of Cosmetology or Elite Academy of Hair Design are eligible to apply.
3. Maintained a level of employment working summers/after school while a student at BHS.
4. Points will be awarded for applicants who participate in athletics, cheering, band, chorus, thespians or other recognized school activity.
5. Bonus points will be awarded for volunteer service that is documented for out of school activities.

Examples: Soup Kitchen, Boy Scouts, hospital volunteer, nursing home volunteer, fire department, etc.

6. A completed Bellaire High School Endowment Fund Scholarship Consolidated Application Form is required for consideration for this scholarship.
7. The recipient of the Pappano Family Scholarship will be determined based on grades, community service and the recommendation of Andrea Koteles or other designee as well as all factors presented on the application of the student.

No funds for this scholarship shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

David Freeman Scholarship

_____ The David Freeman Scholarship, Class of 1961, is a \$1,000.00 scholarship to an individual intending to pursue education in a technical or trade school or at an accredited college/university leading to a certificate in a trade or a two-year/four-year degree in a specific trade. The scholarship will be paid in two separate \$500.00 installments over two consecutive school years. The student must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher while pursuing their education.

To be eligible for this award, a graduating senior must

8. Attend a trade school or college/university to pursue a certificate or two-year/four year degree in a specific trade.
9. Must have maintained a 2.50 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale through the end of the third nine-week grading period of their senior year.
10. Have financial need based on Ohio Family Median income level in the year of application.
11. Points awarded for participation in extra-curricular school organized activities.
12. Points awarded for volunteer service outside of the school that is documented.
13. A completed Bellaire High School Endowment Fund Scholarship Consolidated Application Form is required for consideration for this scholarship.

No funds for this scholarship shall be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

The Richard Hornbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund

Purpose: *The Richard Hornbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund* awards scholarships to college-bound high school seniors based on demonstrated academic achievement, community service and an express interest in pursuing a bachelor's degree in the field of *business or economics*.

The Endowment Board is looking for applicants for *The Richard Hornbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund* to meet the following:

- Minimum 2.5 GPA or higher
- Minimum ACT Score – 20
- Minimum 93% High School Attendance Rate

If an applicant does not meet all three of the minimum requirements they will not qualify for the scholarship.

Criteria: The students eligible for *The Richard Hornbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund* are graduating seniors from Bellaire High School who intend to continue their education at a four-year college or university. Consideration will be given to academic achievement and the student's community service record. Students should submit a scholarship application on the form provided by the Bellaire High School Endowment Fund.

In addition to the completed **Bellaire High School Endowment Fund Application** the Endowment Board will also be looking for the following:

- Quality of required Essay
- Results of Personal Interview
- Applicants **MUST** submit the description from the course catalog for the program in business or economics they will be pursuing from the four-year college or university they have selected.

Guidelines: *The Richard Hornbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund* will be awarded on an annual basis and disbursed in equal payments in August and January. The first payment will be disbursed in January following the completion of the first semester of college. Students will be required to submit their official grade transcript for monies to be forwarded to their college or university providing they maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher average. No funds for the award will be paid to any person other than the institution they are attending.

Student must remain registered in a business or economics major program for the scholarship to be continued.

Amount: *The Richard Hornbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund* will be determined on a yearly basis. 95% of the monies earned must be distributed each year.

PLEASE NOTE: Guidelines may be amended from year to year and scholarships will be based on funds available.

The Bellaire High School Endowment Board will provide information to the Executor of the Richard Hornbeck Estate for the first five years of the scholarship.
